\overleftrightarrow Walking in Oita Prefecture \overleftrightarrow

Oita Prefecture is famous for its bountiful nature and beautiful scenery. With the arrival of spring and warmer weather, there are many activities that people can enjoy outside. For those who enjoy walking in the countryside, Oita offers beautiful walking trails for people of all levels of physical fitness. Walking routes are often only a short train or car ride away, and so it is worth getting in touch with tourist offices in Oita to check out potential rambling routes.

To hopefully get people inspired to get outside and enjoy a leisurely hike in Oita, I would like to write a little about two very different hikes I took in Oita Prefecture in November 2015.

☆ Kyushu Olle Okubungo Course

A hike between Bungo-Ono and Taketa

The Jeju Olle Foundation in South Korea has spread its famous walking routes to Oita Prefecture, and the Okubungo Course is a perfect way to experience both the natural beauty and the culture of Oita Prefecture in a single day's walk.

My friend and I started the approximately 12km walk from Asaji Station, where friendly staff members provided us with maps and took commemorative photos. We then set off, quickly entering the countryside as we rambled up a grassy hillside path shaded by trees.

With ribbons placed at regular intervals to mark our way, the course was easy to follow (we only got briefly lost once!). Additionally, our guide, who occasionally caught up to us in his car to show us the way and teach us about the history of the area, ensured that we had a greater understanding of the area we were trekking through. While some parts of the walk are steep, the walk is mainly along smooth or grassy paths, meaning that there is no scrambling. It is a perfect course for beginners or those who are not confident in their fitness level.

What really made the walk special were the landmarks. The purpose of the Olle course is to incorporate places of historical and cultural importance into a nature walk. We therefore enjoyed several amusing diversions during our walk, such as visiting the stone Buddha at Fukoji Temple and wandering among the Oka Castle ruins in Taketa. It was an amazing experience to be walking along country paths and then to suddenly enter the Fukoji Temple and see the giant Buddhist image carved into the mountain.

My favourite part of the walk came towards the end. As we approached Taketa City, we walked up a steep forest hill until we came to the Oka Castle Ruins. For a small fee, we were able to leisurely explore the old castle walls and take in the beautiful surrounding views. Although only some walls of the castle remain, from their scale it was possible for us to get a sense of the vastness of the old castle. The area of the ruins is famous for both its autumn leaves and for its cherry blossoms, making it the perfect end to an autumnal or spring hike.

We finally made our way to Taketa City at the end of the route, just as the lanterns were being lit for the Chikuraku Bamboo Lantern Festival. Tired from our walk, we walked through streets paved with glittering lamps, feeling almost as if the lights were guiding us to the station and the train that would take us back to Oita City. It was an atmospheric and wonderful experience.

☆ Mt. Tsurumi

In contrast to the Okubungo walk, the other walk I embarked upon that same month was a lot more challenging. My friends and I decided to hike Mt. Tsurumi, the large and beautiful mountain that stands proudly over Beppu City.

We started off bright and early, ready to take on the mountain. The hike up Mt. Tsurumi is by no means a gentle one, and almost immediately we were huffing and puffing our way up a steep incline. The vast majority of the walk is in heavily wooded areas, through which we were often forced to scramble on our hands and knees (I recommend taking a pair of gardener's gloves or similar). It was hard not to occasionally consider packing it all in, when no matter how high we climbed, the peak seemed to never get any nearer. Although the friends I was climbing with are very fit, I am definitely less so, and my morale wasn't helped by occasionally running into spry and fit hikers, who seemingly without breaking a sweat would cheerily greet us as they walked down the mountain.

However, when we occasionally stopped to catch our breath and have some water, we caught glimpses of the beautiful views

between the trees, giving us new energy and motivation. We carried on clambering over rocks and branches, until eventually the trees began to disperse and suddenly we were on an open, mist-shrouded path leading to the top of the mountain. We were ecstatic to reach the top (see the photo below for evidence of our smiling faces) and the views from the top of the mountain were, though misty, beautiful.



We hurriedly ate our lunch in the cable car station before beginning the long descent down the mountain. There is a cable car service that runs up and down Mt. Tsurumi, but we decided to go by foot. The way down was difficult, especially for someone as clumsy me (I often had to half-slide on my back down some of the rockier scrambles). When we eventually reached the bottom of the mountain, we were exhausted but triumphant, and went to eat a large meal of Indian food to celebrate. I would also recommend any potential hiker to go to one of Beppu's wonderful onsen to rest their weary legs.

Climbing Mt. Tsurumi isn't an easy hike, and I would encourage only those with a degree of physical fitness to attempt it, but it was a wonderful experience. Now whenever I see views of the mountain from Beppu or from my home in Oita City, I always smile remembering how exhausted and happy we were on reaching its peak. In the spring, the views from the top must be particularly spectacular – it's almost enough to tempt me to tackle the mountain again!

I hope that these stories have inspired some of you to investigate hiking routes in Oita Prefecture to enjoy this spring. I know that there are lots of hikes I've already planned on and can't wait to get walking. --- *Miri*
