

Lights, Camera, Oita!

If you are interested in a place or a region, then it's only natural that you might want to read about it in a book or a comic book, or see it on the big screen. Oita Prefecture may not appear in fiction as frequently as Tokyo or Osaka, but it has served as the backdrop or inspiration for many entertaining works of fiction.

Here is a quick guide to some notable instances where Oita has appeared in fictional works.

Films:

● Kara-age USA, 2014

Usa City is famous for its delicious *kara-age* (fried chicken) and so it's only natural that kara-age would play a prominent role in this drama film. Ai Takashi stars as a woman from Usa returning to her home-town after an absence of many years to help her family make fried chicken. The title is a pun –the name Usa is often mis-read as “U.S.A.”, and the film features American characters.

● Tsunai Hiichatta! (“Play at Tug-of-War!”), 2012

Despite boasting many wonderful tourist spots and things to do, Oita City is somewhat overshadowed by the prefecture's more famous tourist destinations, Beppu and Yufuin. In this good-natured comedy, Oita City officials attempt to boost the city's profile through the formation of a women's tug-of-war team! For fans of underdog Japanese sports films such as “Waterboys”, this is a must-see.

● Kao (“Face”), 2000

A dark film about sisters and murder. A woman commits a crime and runs from the law, traveling throughout Japan to evade the police. Although the majority of the film is not set in Oita Prefecture, the famous Himeshima Island *Kitsune Odori* (fox dance), - which is part of the Bon-Odori festival - appears during one of the film's most dramatic scenes. Himeshima is a little-known area of Oita, famous for its delicious prawns, and the Fox Dance each summer is a popular event for tourists. This film offers a chance to see one of Oita's most unique festivals.



Manga:

● Shingeki no Kyojin (“Attack on Titan”) by Hajime Isayama, 2009-Present

Although “Attack on Titan” is set in a fictional world, with inspiration for the setting drawn from multiple sources, the author of the manga, Hajime Isayama, is originally from Hita City and so the manga has a strong link to Oita Prefecture. Isayama has continued to maintain a connection with Oita Prefecture since starting the manga. He cut the ribbon on the opening day of the OPAM “Attack on Titan” exhibition in 2015, and also has drawn an illustration of the lead characters from “Attack on Titan” fighting alongside Mejiron (Oita’s mascot) and Kumamon (Kumamoto’s mascot) in honour of the victims of the Kumamoto Earthquake in 2016. If you are a fan of the manga, why not take the train to Hita City and see if the sweeping mountain vistas remind you of the mountains that are backdrop of many of the human vs. man-eating giants battles of “Attack on Titan”.

TV Programmes:

● Kaze no Haruka (“Haruka of the Wind”), 2005-2006

Japanese *asadora* (serialised morning drama series made by NHK) have been broadcast since the early sixties. There are two *asadora* each year, and episodes are shown daily. *Asadora* take place all over Japan, and in 2005 an *asadora* set in Oita Prefecture was broadcast. In “Kaze no Haruka” a young woman named Haruka is living in Yufuin, but she dreams of moving to Osaka to reunite with her mother and become a travel agent. The programme divides its time between Haruka’s new life in Osaka and her old hometown in Oita where her father and sister remain.



● Gunshi Kanbei (“Kanbei the Tactician”), 2014

Junichi Okada (“The Eternal Zero”) plays Kuroda Kanbei, a famous feudal lord of the Sengoku Period of civil war dating from the late fifteenth century to the late sixteenth century. Those who live in Oita Prefecture will of course know that Kuroda Kanbei built Nakatsu Castle, and those who wish to meet a (much cuter and less scary) mascot version of Kuroda Kanbei need only to hop on the train to Nakatsu City. Viewers of this period drama can learn about the history of Kuroda Kanbei, one of Oita’s most famous samurai and a man who helped shape the history of northern Kyushu.

Books:

● Kyūnen Mae no Inori (“A Prayer of Nine Years Ago”) by Ono Masatsugu, 2014

This work won the prestigious Akutagawa Prize, one of Japan’s biggest literary awards. The book is a collection of short stories, and the titular story depicts a single mother returning to the small hometown village of her childhood in Saiki, Oita Prefecture, now accompanied by her own young son. Masatsugu is a native of Oita Prefecture and has stated that he draws inspiration from his hometown when writing his works.
