

Summer Energy Conservation

~Ways to cut down on energy use~

This year, Kyushu Electric Power has asked for residents' support in reducing power usage by 10% (based on usage rates of 2010) between July 2nd and September 7th (excluding August 13th ~15th for *Obon*), in particular between the hours of 9am and 8pm. A goal for a further 3% cut in power usage between the peak hours of 1pm and 5pm is also in place.

From late May onward, many offices in Japan set energy conservation goals for the summer months, and design practical methods as to how they will achieve them. Some of

the methods that the Oita Prefecture Government plans to implement this year include; halting one or more elevators, raising the temperature of the airconditioning to 28°C, implementing cool-biz work wear, turning off unnecessary electrical appliances such as refrigerators and water heating pots, and growing 緑のカーテン (midori no ka-ten) or 'green curtains' against the side of buildings in an attempt to lower the temperature inside their offices. In addition to this, many businesses have recognised the peak energy consumption times (approximately 1pm~5pm)

and plan to implement additional energy-saving methods between these hours. These plans include pushing lunch breaks back one hour, and unplugging laptops and running them on their stored up battery source.

Energy consumption is also something that we can contribute to on an individual level. One of the biggest energy-users in a home is often the air-conditioner. When using your air-conditioner, raise the temperature one or two degrees, use the timer setting to prevent it running for long periods of time, and try to turn it off ahead of time when you are leaving the house. Regularly cleaning the filters will also ensure that it is running as efficiently as possible.

Over this summer, try to keep in mind the peak energy usage hours (1pm ~ 5pm), and do your best to avoid running electrical appliances, such as vacuum cleaners, washing machines and dishwashers, between these hours of the day. Residents are also encouraged to get out of the house during the peak energy usage hours and visit public facilities.

On July 7th (the day of *tanabata* and 'cool earth day'), Oita prefecture is promoting a 'candle night' initiative from 8pm to 10pm, to encourage families to gather together in one room and spend time together by the light of a candle, or go outside and look at the stars. Businesses and groups taking part in the event are encouraged to register online, and print out a card to display in their workplace, stating that they are participating in the 'candle night' event.

~Making a green curtain~



For those with a green thumb, why not try making your own *midori no ka-ten*? After reading up on the benefits of green curtains, the materials needed to make one, and whether or not they are in fact easy to make, I decided to make one of my own. The materials that you will need to make a green curtain can be purchase fairly cheaply at a home center, and in some cases at a 100yen shop. I went to my nearest home center with my shopping list to buy supplies and when I arrived, I found that the home center not only sold prepackaged DIY kits for making your own green curtain, they actually had these kits set up on display with some healthy looking vines already tracing their way up the

netting. How could I resist?

The cost of the DIY kit, two 20L bags of soil, two packets of seeds, and three planter boxes came to around 4000yen. Assembling the kit took no more than 30minutes, but preparing the seeds for planting can around 48hours, depending on the vines you choose to plant. As an experiment I went with a 朝顔

(asagao): 'morning glory' vines on the right side, and $\vec{\exists} - \forall$ (go-ya): 'bitter melon' vine on the right side. The vine that grows the fastest and proves itself as the best curtain will be the winner.

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Materials that you will need to build a similar sized green curtain include:

- Six 2m long sturdy plastic poles
- Plastic netting approx. 2m x 2m
- Seeds (morning glory and bitter melon are both fast growing vines commonly used in green curtains)
- Planter pots (either two 65cm long pots or three 50cm long pots)
- Approx. 40L of planter soil (often just called プランターの土 *puranta no tsuchi*)
- Cable ties/ zip ties (to attach the netting to the poles)
- Waterproof tape (to bind the poles together)

Preparing the seeds for planting will take

24~48hours depending on the seeds. For morning glory, use a nail file or pumice stone to lightly file down one side of the seed. Soak them in water for 24hours or until the seeds split and you can see a white sprout beginning to grow. For bitter melon seeds, trim off the pointed end of the seed and soak them in water for around 5 days, or until they begin to sprout (this may take up to 10 days).

When assembling the 'curtain' frame, use the waterproof tape to secure each of the poles in place to make a grid, leaving enough room at the base of the upright poles for them to stand in the planter pots. Spread out the netting and fasten to the framework using cable ties. Once assembled, sit the framework into the planter pots and fill them with the soil. Burying the base of



the poles in the planter pots will help keep your curtain stable, but if your balcony is particularly windy, you may need to secure it more firmly.

Once the vines are long enough, train them up through the netting. You could try using twist ties to secure the vines to your net if necessary. When the vines are really thriving, it is best to prune the lower runners, and keep the overall shape in check to ensure you get the most out of your green curtain. If your curtain is successful, it should help to lower the temperature in your apartment, by sheltering it from the direct sunlight. If you decide to grow a fruit or vegetable bearing tree, you will also have delicious edible produce. Happy growing!

Note: as I have chosen to build my green curtain on my balcony against one half of my apartment, it will restrict my access to

this door. Keep in mind that once fully grown, your green curtain will be fairly large and almost impossible to move, so be sure to plan its position accordingly.





Natural disasters: a refresher on preparation and procedure

~Typhoons~

As Japan is a country prone to natural disasters, it is important to be aware of the dangers and what to do should a disaster occur. The TOMBO has addressed this topic several times over the years, but with typhoon season approaching, over the next few issues the editor will take this opportunity to revise the main types of natural disasters, and procedures to follow should one occur.

Typhoon season in Japan is typically from August to September, but typhoons have been known to hit in July and October as well. Typhoons in Japan are typically divided into five classifications that describe the scope of the area affected:

Gokuchiisai very small
Kogata small
Chuugata medium
Oogata large
Chou-oogata very large

Oogata and chou-oogata typhoons can cover a radius of up to (and in some cases over) 800km, and will bring extremely strong winds and rain, and can result in flooding and landslides.

Preparing for a typhoon (台風 たいふう taifuu)

1. Locate your nearest evacuation shelter or site

- 2. Determine possible escape routes
- 3. Prepare a survival kit (useful in event of any natural disaster)
- 4. Prepare enough food and water for around three days (necessary in the event of any natural disaster)

When a typhoon occurs

- Stay inside
- Listen to the radio of TV for information/updates
- Close storm shutters if you have them. If not, cover your windows with plastic film or tape in the shape of an X
- Secure outdoor objects or bring them inside
- Turn off gas
- Ensure that you have an adequate supply of water for sanitary purposes. Fill your bathtub and other large containers with water
- Evacuate if advised.

More useful words on warnings and evacuation

- 1. 注意報 ちゅういほう *chuuihou* Advisory warning: people should be aware that a disaster may occur
- 2. 警報 けいほう keihou- Disaster warning: for impending disaster or hazardous situation (urgent)
- 3. 避難所・避難場所 ひなんじょ・ひなんばしょ *hinanjo*・*hinanbasho* Evacuation shelter
- 4. 避難勧告 ひなんかんこく hinankankoku-Evacuation advisory: government **recommendation** that people living in vulnerable areas should evacuate
- 5. 避難命令・避難指示 ひなんめいれい・ひなんしじ hinanmeirei・hinanshiji Evacuation order: government **order** for people living in vulnerable areas to evacuate (urgent)



LANGUAGE LEARNING PAGE



This section aims to teach new kanji characters to beginner-level Japanese learners, and to give intermediate and advanced learners a deeper understanding of each character. This month's character set is:

MATHEMATICS「数学」

The first character in the compound 「数」, is read as $\overset{\overset{\circ}{z}}{\overset{\circ}{c}}\overset{\overset{\circ}{v}}{\overset{\circ}{c}}\overset{\overset{\circ}{v}}{\overset{\circ}{o}}$, かず or かぞえる. The character is a combination of woman 「女」, rice 「米」 and a hand holding a stick 「攵」, which together depict a woman counting rice with a stick.

NUMBER/TO COUNT 「数」

The second character in the compound 「学」, which is read 「ガク」, or 「まなぶ」 combines child 「子」 and roof 「一」. When combined, it shows a child under a roof to mean 'learning'.

LEARING/STUDY 「学」

If we combine the characters for "number" and "learning/study" we get the compound:

MATHEMATICS「数学」

The following sentence uses the above characters to exemplify their different readings.

^{きんねん すうがく まな がくせい かず へ</sub> 近年、数学を学ぶ学生の数が減ってきています。}

In recent years, the number of students that study mathematics has been decreasing.

Japanese Onomatopoeia

Have you ever found yourself in a Japanese conversation surrounded by 'sounds'? In Japanese, onomatopoeia ('giongo' or 'gitaigo') is used to describe tastes, textures, sensations, sounds, feelings and much more.

As the weather warms up here in Oita prefecture, we get closer and closer to the yearly summer festivals. Despite the heat and the crowds I always find myself drawn to the energy and excitement of summer festivals. Have you ever paid close attention to the variety of sounds at a festival?

Ambling slowly (ぶらぶら歩く bura bura aruku) along the rows of *yatai* (street stalls/festival stalls), the stall flags and banners flutter gently (はたはた hata hata) in the breeze. You take a moment to ponder what festival food takes your fancy, and then fight your way through the crowds of excited, bustling (かくかく waku waku) people to your stall of choice. The *okonomiyaki* sizzles (ジュージュー jyuu jyuu) on the hot plate as you wait to be served.

The highlight of the festival is always seeing the fireworks, or *hanabi* as they whiz ($\[\] \] \]$ — pyuu) into the air and then explode with a boom ($\[\] \]$ — $\[\] \]$ don)! When everything is over, you make your way home, accompanied by the chirping ($\[\] \]$ $\[\] \]$ iii) of cicadas.

School Handbook for foreign students, their parents and teachers (Elementary School) ~Necessities of Life~


