# The Sweetest Town in Oita

By now I'm sure you've had your fair share of festival *kakigori*, "Black Thunder" ice cream bars, and any other number of icy treats to stay cool during this crazy summer heat. But if you're craving

crazy summer heat. But if you're craving some less conventional flavors to keep from melting into the sidewalk, a visit to Taketa City is in your future.

Through September 30<sup>th</sup> the small historic town of Taketa, set in the south west mountains of Oita, offers an ice cream scavenger hunt. Some of the soft serve flavors featured in the hunt can be found all year round, such as brown rice, soy sauce,

and *ramune*. Others are served exclusively during the summer months for the festival, bringing the total to 23 unique flavors.

Taketa is accessible via train and car. From Oita Station take the train to Bungo-Taketa station which is located on the edge of the historic downtown area, and an easy walk away from soy sauce, *adzuki*, and brown rice ice creams. If you're looking for a relaxed day of history and a scenic trip, the train is an excellent option, but

to make the most of your trip, it's definitely better to have a car. Taketa 'county', if you will, is comprised of four smaller towns; Taketa, Ogi, Naoiri, and Kuju. Each town offers a variety of attractions and ice cream flavors.

Ogi is a small agricultural town, known for tomatoes. Only two ice cream flavors can be found in Ogi (tomato soft cream and tomato sherbet), but the town's main attractions are Shiramizu Falls, and breathtaking views of the mountain range. Kuju is a dairy

town, and hosts eight flavors scattered throughout the area. Also featuring Mt. Kuju, the flower park, a winery and brewery, and several beautiful *onsen*, it really is

hard to beat Kuju. There is a lot of ground to cover, but if you're up for a stunning drive through the mountains

and farmland, Kuju is well worth the trip. Naoiri is an *onsen* town, home to Nagayu *onsen* and known for delicious spring water. With seven flavors of ice cream, Naoiri boasts two of the most abstract flavors (spinach and soft-shell turtle... yes, turtle). The spinach flavor is quite good, and those who aren't huge fans of the leafy greens needn't worry: it's not like eating your veggies. The turtle flavor however, is ... interesting. I'm glad to have the experience but let's just say it's one I'd rather not repeat. If you do plan on

trying the turtle soft serve, think about saving a safer flavor for afterward. We saved the *ramune* soft serve, and were pleased with the much sweeter ice cream and a free foot *onsen*. There are three more flavors in between the four towns, so try not to miss the corn cream, strawberry, and black soybean flavors.

All you need to participate is a map/brochure (available at all participating shops), a sense of adventure, and an empty ice-cream-stomach. Maybe some friends too,

so you can try more flavors! Each ice cream is found at a different local shop or *onsen*, and is accompanied by a stamp to keep track of your ice cream count. If you haven't seen much of the rural side of Oita, this is a great way to tour small towns and support the local shops and *onsen* of Taketa.

"Sure Savvy, it's great that your town has ice cream. I can get ice cream in my city though," you might be thinking. Well my friend, did I mention there are some pretty snazzy prizes up for

grabs if you trek down here to collect stamps? If you collect between 2 and 10 stamps you can enter the draw for the first tier of prizes, including meal vouchers

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at participating restaurants, sets of Taketa's specialty products (wine, yogurt, seasonings, etc.), and *onsen* passes. Collecting half the stamps could win you some fancier food items like Bungo Ono beef, a Dutch wine set, and an *onsen* visit package. By collecting all 23 stamps, you become an official "Taketa Soft Cream Ambassador," complete with badge and certification, and can enter the grand prize drawing for a ¥30,000 accommodation voucher package. I might be a bit biased, but I'm pretty sure Taketa is one of the most beautiful and interesting places in Oita. You might come for the ice cream, but you'll want to stay for the history, gorgeous scenery, and welcoming people.



#### **Available Flavors by Town**

**Kuju:** *kabosu*, cheese and wine (a non-alcoholic version is available, so you can still drive to more ice cream places!), Jersey cow milk, blueberry gelato, black sesame seed, *honobono* (let's just call it a mystery flavor), soy milk, and yogurt **Naoiri:** grape, *ramune*, soft-shell turtle, spinach, chunky strawberry gelato, Dutch wine, and homemade soy milk

Taketa: brown rice, soy sauce, and adzuki (sweet red bean)

Ogi: tomato sherbet, and Ogi tomato

Extra: corn cream, strawberry, and black soybean

If you're looking for a way to escape the summer heat for a few hours, why not visit the Oita Art Museum in Oita City? The Art Museum offers around six different special collections throughout the year, with a variety of traditional and modern pieces.

At present, the Oita Art Museum is featuring the special collection by modern sculptor, painter and novelist Yayoi Kusama. The "Eternity of Eternal Eternity" exhibit features over 100 pieces, and will be on display until October 20<sup>th</sup>. Yayoi Kusama is well known for her polka dot design pieces, and this exhibit is no exception.

In addition to canvas artworks, the exhibit also features several large sculptures, including one of a gigantic spotted

pumpkin. Furthermore, unlike many gallery exhibitions, there a few points where visitors are permitted to take photos of the artworks, not only outside of the exhibit course, but also inside. And of course if you'd like to take a little piece of polka dotted history home with you, the Art Museum gift shop has a fun selection of gifts and souvenirs.


